

General Tips:

Confidentiality and Privacy:

- No youth should be made to feel guilty for not participating or coerced into providing information, they do not feel comfortable sharing.
- The youth can choose not to take the survey, not to answer any question within the survey, or to stop taking the survey at any time.
 - The youth does not need to answer all questions for their survey to be counted.
 - No information will be released about a single person

Obtaining Consent:

You must ask the people you approach if they are willing to participate in the survey. If they say no, do not push them further. Thank them for their time and make sure to count them using the "Observation" survey. Also, know that an individual can refuse to participate in the survey at any time. If you have already answered questions for the individual, respect their decision and thank them for their time, delete the survey answers and complete an "Observation" survey.

Respect and Courtesy:

While the interview is generally only lasts approximately 5-10 minutes there is still an opportunity to develop feelings of trust.

You can do this by:

- Avoiding judgement
- Showing participants that you are interested in what they have to say. Maintain eye contact, have open body language, and listen to their answers.
- Using familiar, everyday language that will be easily understood. Ask survey questions as written, but feel free to provide clarification if the participants has questions.
- Make sure to practice social distancing while asking the survey questions and wear your mask at all times

Asking Sensitive or Seemingly Obvious Questions:

There are a few questions that could be deemed to be very sensitive or obvious, for example questions about gender and ethnicity. While you are conducting the survey, do not assume any characteristics about a person including ethnicity, gender, age or any other qualities.

If you are uncomfortable asking certain questions, you may want to start the survey with something like:

"I need to ask every person the same set of questions using the same language. As a result, I will be asking you a number of questions that you may think are obvious. We ask these questions to gather important information. I don't want to make any assumptions."

Be aware of your surroundings:

You and your team should be aware of your surroundings. Pay close attention to the body language of everyone that is near. If you feel uncomfortable, nervous or threatened in a shelter, service or on the street, let your PIT Leader know and withdraw from the situation.



Be	eginning Suggested Script:
Hi	how are you? My name is, I use [she/he/they/] pronouns, and I'm working with the Dallas and Collin County CoC as part of Metro Dallas Youth Committee. The youth point in time count is a project to help us better understand the experiences of youth and young adults in Dallas and Collin County who are unstably housed, and how we can better help youth who may not have a stable or safe place to stay at night. To do this, we are surveying people under 25 so that we can better understand their experiences with unstable housing and couch surfing. Do you mind if I ask you a few questions? Are you under 25?
If t	the youth is 25 or older, you can stop here. Thank them for their time and provide them with any materials or resources available to them.
	they are under 25, continue: If you choose to participate, all your answers will remain confidential. We will not share any information specifically about you with anyone and your answers will never be associated with your name. You can skip any questions you don't want to answer or stop the survey at any time. You will receive a youth pack for taking the survey. It usually takes about 10 minutes to complete and your participation is completely voluntary. Do you have any questions? Would you like to participate? the youth says no, stop here. Thank them for their time and provide them with a youth pack and resources available to them. If the youth says yes, continue:

	If the youth is unsure if they have been interviewed or not, you can ask them if they would like to go ahead and take the survey and remind them, they are able to stop at any time.

	If the youth ask why this information is needed, you can explain that this helps us to make sure we are not counting the same person twice, and that it will not be used to identify them. As with all questions, if a youth feels uncomfortable giving this information, you can remind them that their answers are confidential, but do not pressure a youth to answer the question.
4.	What is your gender? Youth may be more sensitive to being asked these questions due to their personal nature. If the youth express discomfort with these questions, you can advise them to select the 'refused' option. As with all questions,

youth are not required to answer. If the youth agree to answer these questions, advise them to select all that apply. If the youth's identity/orientation is not one of the given options, advise the youth to use the 'other'

option and to describe their gender identity in the space provided.

Youth may be more sensitive to being asked this question due to concerns about being reported, so it is good to remind them that their survey answers are confidential. Explain that learning about their sources of income helps us understand how to best improve their access to the money and resources they need to find a stable place to live. Do not pressure youth to answer the question.
