

## YOUTH Rapid Re-Housing

A time limited housing intervention program that connects households to permanent housing through medium-term financial assistance and tailored supportive services.

<p>Medium-term rental assistance and supportive services program that rapidly re-houses and stabilizes homeless households into permanent housing. Rental assistance amount is not variable based on household income.</p> <p>RRH programs participate in HMIS and accept referrals from Coordinated Access System (CAS).</p> <p>Program enrollments can be <b>administered virtually</b> and <b>signed electronically</b>.</p>	<p><u>Case Management</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Critical Documentation Support</li> <li>• Housing stabilization/Exit planning</li> <li>• Housing location</li> <li>• Employment assistance</li> <li>• Linkage to mainstream resources, including physical and psychological health</li> <li>• Transportation</li> <li>• Financial, lease, and household management</li> <li>• Landlord mediation</li> <li>• Home visits, minimum once per month*</li> <li>• Life skills support</li> <li>• Young parenting support</li> </ul> <p><u>Temporary Financial Assistance</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Rental assistance provision based on lease and housing stabilization plan, not income based</li> <li>• Landlord incentives for eligible costs, as needed, as available</li> <li>• Flex funds for ineligible costs</li> <li>• Move-in costs</li> <li>• Utility allowance</li> <li>• Furniture and move in kits Relocations**</li> </ul> <p><u>Best Practice/Evidence Based Practices</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Include Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion in all practices</li> <li>• Housing First</li> <li>• Harm Reduction</li> <li>• Progressive Engagement</li> <li>• Trauma Informed Care</li> <li>• Equal Access</li> <li>• Cultural Competency</li> </ul> <p>*Weekend home visits might be required to fit youth and young adult's needs ** Detailed list of items in move-in kit</p>	<p>Up to 24 months of rental subsidy</p> <p><u>Additional Considerations</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Can provide up to 36 months maximum of RRH if client meets qualifications</li> <li>• Additional case management can be provided up to 24 months post subsidy</li> </ul>	<p>Literally homeless households ages 18-24</p> <p>May be used as a bridge to PSH for qualifying homeless households</p> <p><u>Additional Considerations</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Foster care or child protective services involvement if at risk of homelessness (Category 2)</li> </ul> <p><u>DV Considerations</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Fleeing/attempting to flee DV (Category 4)</li> </ul>	<p>Households referred to RRH will be enrolled in the program within <b>10 business days</b> of referral.</p> <p>RRH households will secure permanent housing within <b>30 days or less</b> from enrollment.</p> <p><b>60%</b> of RRH households will increase cash income.</p> <p><b>80%</b> of RRH households will exit to permanent housing.</p> <p><b>85%</b> of RRH households will remain housed and will not return to shelter within 12 months of exit.</p>
