THE COLLECTIVE NETWORKS, INSTITUTIONS, AND ORGANIZATIONS PROMOTING A COMMUNITY-WIDE COMMITMENT TO THE GOAL OF ENDING HOMELESSNESS

COC PROGRAM FUNDING PROCESS

STEP 1: THE LOCAL SUBMISSION

- Project Applications
- CoC Priority Listing
- Communitywide Application


Consolidated Application Submitted to HUD

STEP 2: THE NATIONAL COMPETITION

- Tier 1 projects are conditionally selected from the highest ranking CoC to the lowest
- Tier 2 projects are given a point value using a 100-point scale
 - Up to 50 points in direct proportion to the CoC Communitywide Application Score
 - Up to 40 points for the CoC ranking of the project
 - Up to 10 points for Service Participation

Funding Levels

- Tier 1 at 30% compared to 90% in last year's competition
- 30% cap on all Permanent Housing Projects (PH-PSH, PH-RRH, Joint TH-RRH) for each CoC


Selection Criteria

- Based on new HUD priorities
- Prioritizes Transitional Housing and Outreach/Supportive Services Only (SSO) Projects
- New service participation and threshold requirements

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Must be a nonprofit organization, state/local government, or instrumentalities of state/local government, public housing authority, (must be a member of the CoC)(page 9 of NOFO)
- 2. Active Registration with Sam.gov and have Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)
- 3. Financial Management Capacity
- 4. Required Participation in HMIS and CAS
- 5. Cost Sharing or Match





ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS


- 1. Program-Specific Requirements (ALL)
 - a) Service Participation Required
 - b) Non-engagement in racial preferences or other forms of illegal discrimination.
 - c) Not allowed to operate drug injection sites or "safe consumption sites," knowingly distribute drug paraphernalia on or off of property under their control, permit the use or distribution of illicit drugs on property under their control, or conduct any of these activities under the pretext of "harm reduction."
- Meet Eligibility and Quality Thresholds
- Compliance with Policy Requirements







System Vision for Eliminating Street Sleeping



- Integrated street response, combining mental health, outreach, and law enforcement to provide immediate relief on the ground.
- 2. Shelters/transitional housing are equipped to bring people inside and wrap individuals in services, navigating them into treatment, recovery, and institutional care when needed.
- **3. Pathways to self sufficiency** supporting households to regain stability, turning over beds so more people can come inside.





FUNDING PRIORITIES - GUIDING PRINCIPLES



- Coordinate and target resources effectively to fill gaps and achieve the system vision (families and singles)
- Promote high performance and capacity building, while protecting tenants
- Remain competitive

Permanent Supportive Housing (PH-PSH)



• Rental assistance and intensive supportive services and treatment for those who have a disability

- New Transitional Housing Projects

Transitional Housing (TH)



• Housing and supportive services to facilitate movement of homeless individuals and families into permanent housing within 24 months

Community-Wide Applications to be submitted by the Lead Agency to be contracted with local service providers upon award

Tier 1	\$ 11,384,378	Permanent Supportive Housing Renewals per CoC Reallocation Plan

STRATEGY

- Only source of sustainable PSH funding
- Avoid displacement of current clients where possible.
- Evaluate all projects to create prioritization for neighbors within PSH

STRATEGY

- The CoC Lead Agency will apply for Centralized Transitional Housing project(s) on behalf of the CoC to consolidate service partnerships in alignment with HUD and communitywide priorities to prevent street sleeping, and promote treatment, service participation, and self-sufficiency.
- New DV Transitional Housing Project(s): The CoC Lead Agency will apply for 2 new projects through the reallocation of current DV Rapid Rehousing projects create DV Transitional Housing for DV survivors.





The U.S Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has released the Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the FY2025 Continuum of Care (CoC) Competition. CoCs are required to evaluate, score, and rank all project applications and determine which projects will be included in the community's Consolidated Application. Each CoC is required to determine how they will rank new and renewal projects related to how they align with HUD and CoC priorities. Funds are prioritized for projects that align with HUD and CoC priorities for ending homelessness: Federal Funding Priorities:

HUD's FY 2025 NOFO outlines the following policy priorities to support the goal of ending homelessness. CoC Consolidated Applications are scored by HUD based on the extent to which they demonstrate alignment with these areas.






