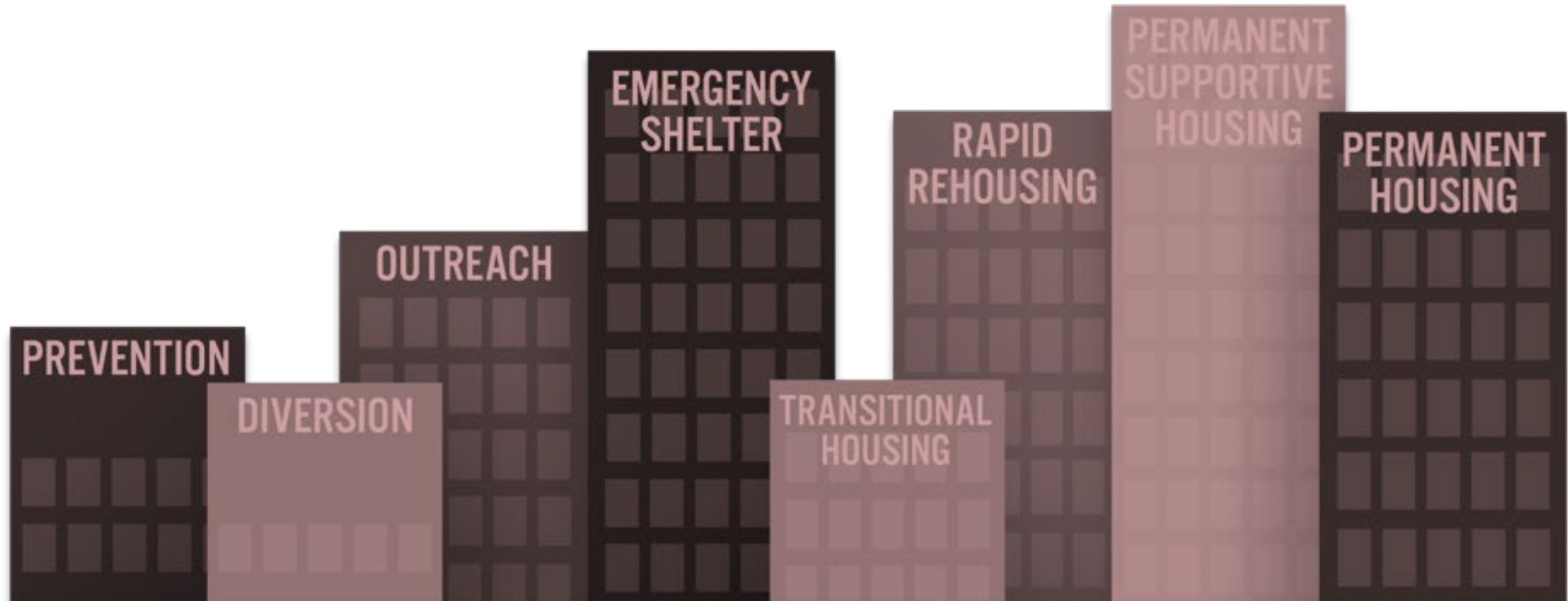

CONTINUUM OF CARE (COC)

THE COLLECTIVE NETWORKS, INSTITUTIONS, AND ORGANIZATIONS PROMOTING A COMMUNITY-WIDE COMMITMENT TO THE GOAL OF ENDING HOMELESSNESS

COC PROGRAM FUNDING PROCESS

• STEP 1: THE LOCAL SUBMISSION

- Project Applications
- CoC Priority Listing
- Communitywide Application

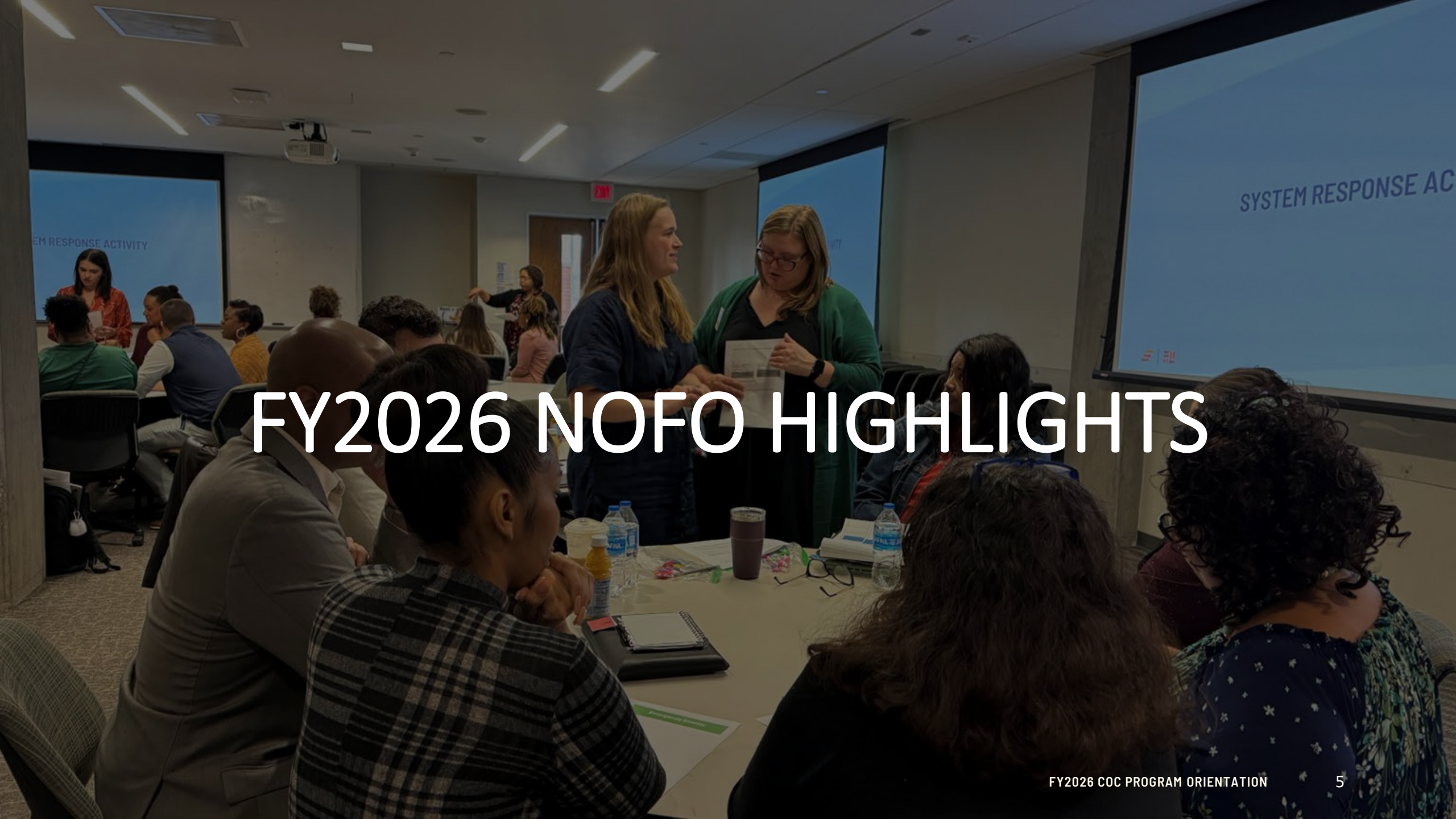


Consolidated Application Submitted to HUD

• STEP 2: THE NATIONAL COMPETITION

- Tier 1 projects are conditionally selected from the highest ranking CoC to the lowest
- Tier 2 projects are given a point value using a 100-point scale
 - Up to 50 points in direct proportion to the CoC Communitywide Application Score
 - Up to 40 points for the CoC ranking of the project
 - Up to 10 points for Service Participation





FY2026 NOFO HIGHLIGHTS

AVAILABLE FUNDING FOR ALL NEIGHBORS COALITION

Amount	Type	Description
\$TBA	TX-600 <u>FY 2026</u> Annual Renewal Demand	Total amount of all projects identified on the HUD-approved Grant Inventory Worksheet (GIW) as eligible for renewal through the competition
\$TBA	Tier 1	Total amount available for projects protected from funding cuts. Equal to 60% of the funding for all eligible renewal projects, as identified on the HUD-approved Grant Inventory Worksheet (GIW).
\$5,000,000 (CoC Bonus) \$TBA (Remaining ARD)	Tier 2	Possible for new projects meeting the eligibility and quality standards outlined in the NOFO; including the expansion of renewal projects
\$5,000,000	DV Bonus Funds	Possible for new projects serving survivors of domestic violence, including expansion of existing projects as described in the NOFO
\$1,500,000	CoC Planning Grant (Noncompetitive)	Designated for Collaborative Applicant to complete CoC Planning Activities



KEY CHANGES FOR FY2026

- Funding Levels
 - Tier 1 at 60% compared to 90% in FY2024 competition
 - 40% of funds must compete in Tier 2 (no longer protected)
- Selection Criteria
 - Based on new HUD priorities
 - Set-asides for DV and Permanent Housing for Families with Children
 - DV and YHDP follow regular Tier 1 and Tier 2 selection processes
 - Prioritizes Transitional Housing and Outreach/Supportive Services Only (SSO) Projects
 - New service participation and threshold requirements

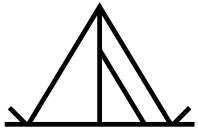


FY26 FUNDING PROCESS

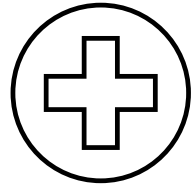
1. CoC Planning
2. Tier 1 Projects
3. DV Bonus projects up to \$104M (not including DV Reallocation or DV renewal projects)
4. Permanent Housing (PH) projects for families with children up to \$430M
5. New Transitional Housing and Supportive Services Only (SSO) projects up to 1.3B
 - If 1.3B not reached, continue on with new projects
 - If 1.3B reached, remove remaining new projects
6. Renewal projects



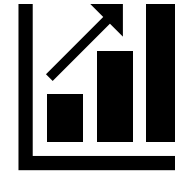

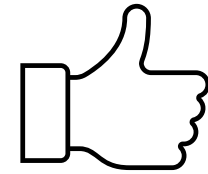

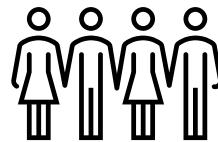

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

1. Must be a nonprofit organization, state/local government, or instrumentalities of state/local government, public housing authority (page 9 of NOFO)
2. Must be a member of the Continuum of Care (page 9 of NOFO)
3. Active Registration with Sam.gov and have Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)
4. Financial Management Capacity
5. Required Participation in HMIS and Coordinated Access System (or comparable database for DV)
6. Required Certifications
7. Cost Sharing or Match



ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS

1. Program-Specific Requirements (ALL)

- a) Non-engagement in racial preferences or other forms of illegal discrimination.
- b) Not allowed to operate drug injection sites or “safe consumption sites,” knowingly distribute drug paraphernalia on or off of property under their control, permit the use or distribution of illicit drugs on property under their control, or conduct any of these activities under the pretext of “harm reduction.”

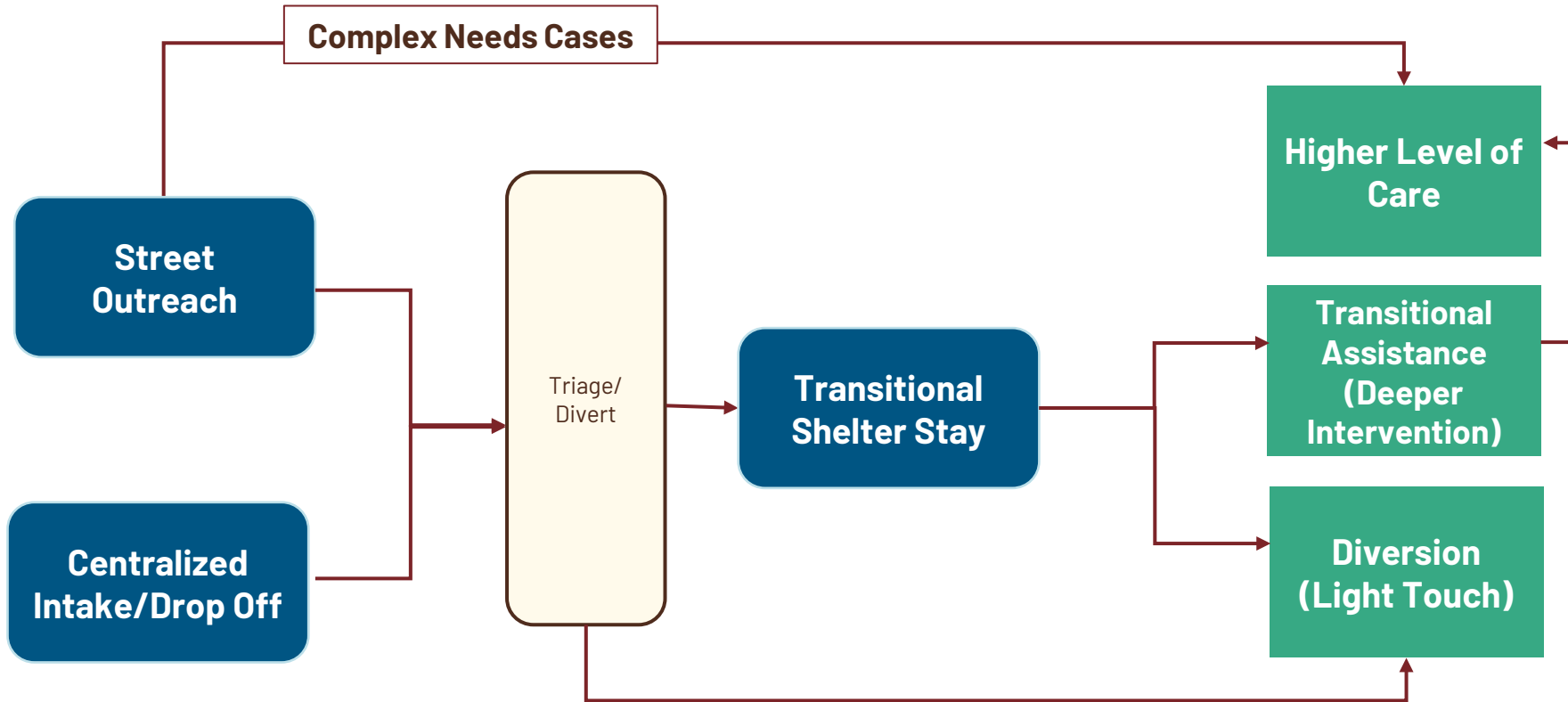

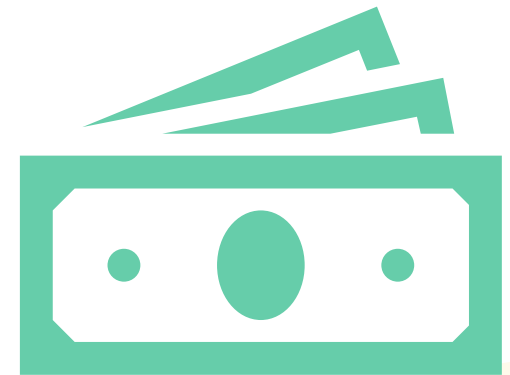

- DV Bonus – expansion of existing projects (in alignment with HUD’s funding process)
- Remaining Permanent Housing (PH) for families (in alignment with HUD’s funding process)
- New Consolidated Transitional Housing (TH) project
- New Consolidated Street Outreach (TH) project
- Other New TH and New Supportive Service Only projects

Description The U.S Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has released the Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) for the FY2026 Continuum of Care (CoC) Competition. CoCs are required to evaluate, score, and rank all project applications and determine which projects will be included in the community's Consolidated Application. Each CoC is required to determine how they will rank new and renewal projects related to how they align with HUD and CoC priorities. Funds are prioritized for projects that align with HUD and CoC priorities for ending homelessness: Federal Funding Priorities:

HUD's FY 2026 NOFO outlines the following policy priorities to support the goal of ending homelessness. CoC Consolidated Applications are scored by HUD based on the extent to which they demonstrate alignment with these areas.

1. Promoting Outcomes and Performance Based Competition
2. Prioritizing Treatment and Recovery
3. Addressing Public Safety, Street Homelessness, Mental Health
4. Promoting Economic Self-Sufficiency
5. Minimizing Trauma

CoC Annual Priorities: The CoC Board approved 2026 Annual CoC Priorities, which include but are not limited to the following strategies:

1. Integrated street response, combining mental health and treatment services, outreach, and law enforcement to provide immediate relief on the ground.
2. Shelters and transitional housing are equipped to bring people inside, wrap individuals in services and navigate them into treatment and recovery, including effective coordination of institutional care when needed.
3. Pathways to stable living—supporting households to regain self-sufficiency, turning over beds so more people can come inside.

New project applications can be funded through CoC Bonus or DV Bonus funding opportunities, as well as reallocation of renewal projects.

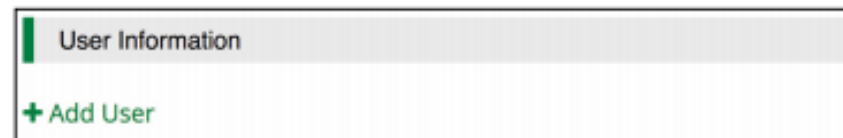

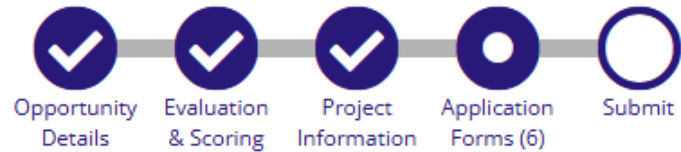

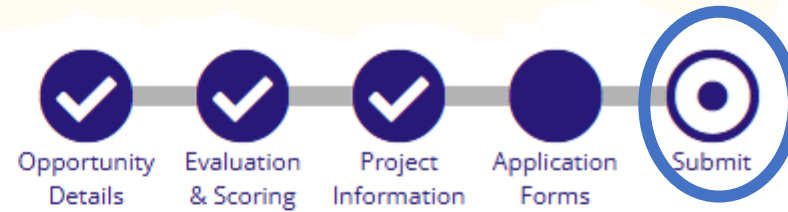
